Higher Apprenticeship in Project Management

Project Management is a growing specialism used increasingly in businesses of all sizes, nationally and internationally. While a business is a continuous and on-going operation, a project is temporary, aimed at producing a unique product, service or process. These projects can result in increased sales, staff productivity and growth of business.

Blackpool & Fylde College's Project Management Centre of Excellence offers a Level 4 Higher Apprenticeship qualification, which is designed to develop practical and theoretical skills. The qualification has been designed in partnership with the Association of Project Management (APM).

The qualification consists of two parts and includes:

- Project management concepts and processes
- Scheduling and budgeting
- Managing risk and quality
- Resourcing and scope

The knowledge element of the course is assessed by two assignments and one examination. Candidates will also be assessed on a range of competencies in their workplace including stakeholder management, project communication and developing the business case. You must be working in a project related role at the required level to be able to take this course. This will be determined by your initial interview. Candidates must be at least 18 years old and be working full time within a project management office.

You will be required to attend college for the knowledge delivery and exam, and the assessments and reviews will be based at your place of work.
