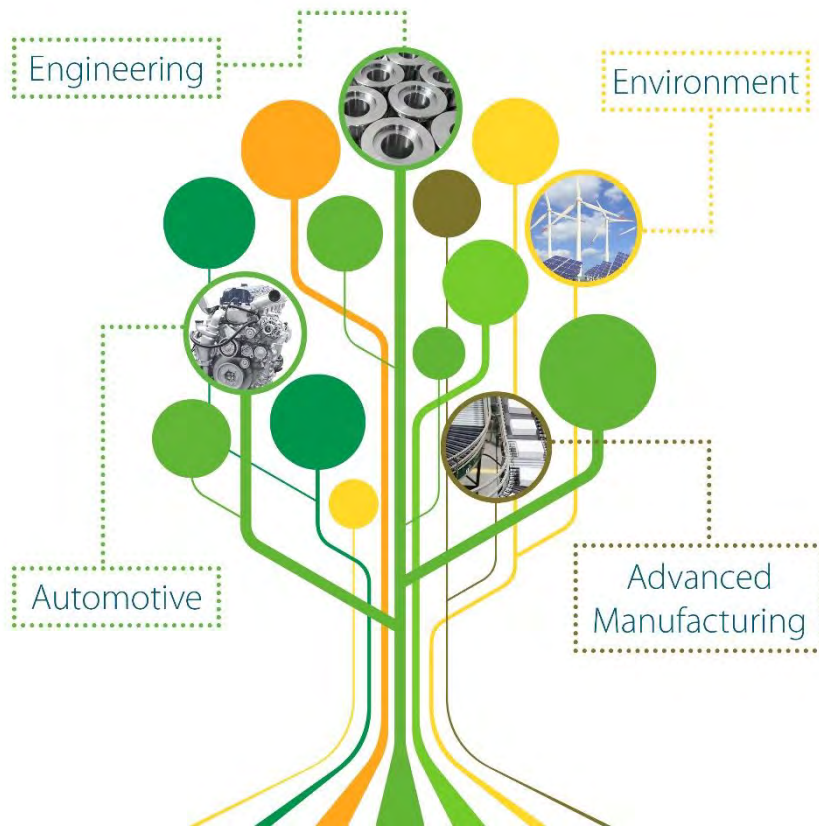


Employment Law – The Essentials
